

Regulations for Establishment of Student Affairs Council at I-Shou University

Adopted on April 12, 2006 at the first meeting of the University Administration Council at the second semester of the academic year 2005

Amendments to Articles 3-6 ratified and promulgated by the President on December 23, 2010

Article 1 The Regulations for Establishment of Student Affairs Council at I-Shou University (hereinafter referred to as the "Regulations") are enacted as per Article 17 of the Charter of I-Shou University.

Article 2 The Student Affairs Council (hereinafter referred to as the "Council") is hereby established to draw up student-related policies and guidelines to facilitate student guidance and counseling, bring functions of teaching, guidance and counseling into full play, create a harmonious campus, and enhance students' mental and physical development.

Article 3 The Council is composed of the following members:

Dean of Student Affairs, college deans, Director of Continuing Education, Curator of the Library, Director of General Education, department chairs (institute directors), Military Training Director, Director of Physical Education, four student representatives, and section chiefs of the Office of Student Affairs.

The Dean of Student Affairs serves as chairperson of the Council.

Article 4 The Council is responsible for:

1. deliberating on student-related regulations and rules;
2. deliberating on special cases of student conduct;
3. guiding and supervising student affairs;
4. discussing major student-related issues.

Article 5 Council members shall meet at least once every semester, and administrative heads of the units concerned may be invited to attend as observers whenever necessary.

Article 6 The Regulations become effective on the third day of promulgation after adopted by the University Administration Council and ratified by the President.

Note: In the event of any disputes or misunderstanding as to the interpretation of the language or terms of these Regulations, the Chinese language version shall prevail.
