

# **Regulations for Application for and Awarding of Chairman's Shu Ye Scholarship at I-Shou University**

Amendments adopted on January 18, 2000

Amendments adopted on November 5, 2008 at the third meeting of the University Administration Council in the first semester of the academic year 2008

Amendments to the Regulations ratified and promulgated by the President on May 27, 2010

Amendments to the Regulations ratified and promulgated by the President on July 29, 2013

- Article 1 The Regulations for Application for and Awarding of Chairman's Shu Ye Scholarship at I-Shou University (hereinafter referred to as the "Regulations") are hereby established to praise undergraduate students who have behaved with integrity and academically performed well.
- Article 2 Graduating senior students enrolled in one of the daytime undergraduate programs at I-Shou University (hereinafter referred to as the "University") are eligible to apply for the scholarship.
- Article 3 The scholarship application period is always announced after the beginning of every second semester.
- Article 4 The Student Activity Section of the Office of Student Affairs (hereinafter referred to as the "Section-in-charge") takes full charge of affairs related to the scholarship program.
- Article 5 In principle, the scholarship budget per academic year is NT\$300,000, and the scholarship is granted to qualified recipients based on priority and ranking. In addition to the scholarship, scholarship recipients will be awarded a medal on the graduation ceremony.
- Article 6 Applicants shall satisfy all of the following basic requirements:
1. having received a conduct score of 80 or higher for seven consecutive semesters (i.e. from the freshman year through the first semester of the senior year);
  2. having never been disciplined with a warning or any other more severe punishment for seven consecutive semesters (i.e. from the freshman year through the first semester of the senior year);
  3. having passed the second stage of GEPT (General English Proficiency Test)

Intermediate Level or any other English proficiency test at the same level, and received a score of 60 or higher on the computer skills test.

Please refer to the comparison chart on English language proficiency levels announced by the Center for General Education for more details on the second stage of GEPT Intermediate Level or any other English proficiency test at the same level as referred to in Subparagraph 3 of the preceding paragraph.

Article 7 Undergraduate students who meet both the basic requirements as referred to in Article 6 and any of the following requirements for Priority 1/2 may file an application:

1. Priority 1:

- a. having received an average semester grade of 80 or higher and been ranked first place in the class for seven consecutive semesters (i.e. from the freshman year through the first semester of the senior year);
- b. having taken part in a national technology competition via individual application or recommendation by the University and won the championship, and having received an average semester grade of 80 or higher for seven consecutive semesters (i.e. from the freshman year through the first semester of the senior year);
- c. having taken part in a major international technology competition via individual application or recommendation by the University and won the championship, and having received an average semester grade of 75 or higher for seven consecutive semesters (i.e. from the freshman year through the first semester of the senior year);
- d. having received a score of 80 or higher for every subject for seven consecutive semesters (i.e. from the freshman year through the first semester of the senior year).
- e. In principle, qualified recipients for Priority 1 will be awarded NT\$60,000 each, but the scholarship amount may be adjusted based on the annual budget as referred to in Article 5.

2. Priority 2:

- a. Minimum Requirement: having received an average semester grade of 80 or higher for seven consecutive semesters (i.e. from the freshman year through the first semester of the senior year);
- b. Those who satisfy the requirement as referred to in the preceding item and collect a total of 61 points or more based on their academic ranking for seven consecutive semesters (i.e. from the freshman year through the first semester of the senior year) will be listed as potential recipients for Priority 2:

- (1) ten points for first place in a class;
- (2) three points for second place in a class;
- (3) one point for third place in a class.

- c. Applicants for Priority 2 are ranked based on the points they merit, and those who have the same points are ranked at the same place.
- d. In principle, qualified recipients for Priority 2 will be awarded NT\$50,000 each, but the scholarship amount may be adjusted based on the annual budget as referred to in Article 5 as well as the number of recipients for Priority 1 and the scholarship awarded to them.

Based on the budget as referred to in Article 5, the scholarship is granted first to recipients satisfying the requirements for Priority 1, and then to those for Priority 2 if there is budget surplus. If the sum of the scholarship to be awarded to recipients for both Priority 1 and 2 exceeds the aforesaid budget, the points that recipients for Priority 2 get will be taken into consideration, and the recipients who have more points will be awarded the scholarship.

Applicants who meet the requirements as referred to in Item 2 or 3 of the first subparagraph in the first paragraph and have outstanding achievements may be commended by the University in addition to the scholarship.

Article 8 Applicants shall submit the following documents for application:

1. one completed scholarship application form;
2. an academic transcript for the past seven semesters (i.e. from the freshman year through the first semester of the senior year);
3. a score report/certificate of an English proficiency test and the computer skills test as referred to in Article 6;
4. Applicants who meet the requirements as referred to in Item 2 or 3 of Subparagraph 1 of Paragraph 1 in Article 7 must submit supporting certificates and/or documents as well.

Article 9 The Scholarship Review Committee will scrutinize all scholarship applications, and a list of qualified scholarship recipients will then be announced by the Section-in-charge after being ratified by the President.

Article 10 The Scholarship Review Committee is headed by the President as chairperson, and committee members are: vice presidents, Dean of Academic Affairs, Dean of Student Affairs, Dean of General Affairs, Secretary-General, Director of Continuing Education, college deans, and Dean of Accounting.

Article 11 The Regulations become effective on the third day of promulgation after being adopted by the University Administration Council and ratified by the President.

*Note: In the event of any disputes or misunderstanding as to the interpretation of the language or terms of these Regulations, the Chinese language version shall prevail.*

- I. Graduating senior students enrolled in one of the daytime undergraduate programs at the University are eligible to apply for the scholarship.
- II. Basic Requirements:
  - (1) having received a conduct score of 80 or higher for seven consecutive semesters (i.e. from the freshman year through the first semester of the senior year);
  - (2) having never been disciplined with a warning or any other more severe punishment for seven consecutive semesters (i.e. from the freshman year through the first semester of the senior year); and
  - (3) having passed the second stage of GEPT Intermediate Level or any other English proficiency test at the same level, and received 60 or higher on the computer skills test.
- III. Applicants shall submit the following documents for application:
  - (1) one completed scholarship application form;
  - (2) an academic transcript for the past seven semesters (i.e. from the freshman year through the first semester of the senior year);
  - (3) a score report/certificate of an English proficiency test and the computer skills test; and
  - (4) Applicants who meet the requirements as referred to in Item 2 or 3 of Subparagraph 1 of Paragraph 1 in Article 7 must submit supporting certificates and/or documents as well.
