

Regulations for Awards to Students of I-Shou University Passing

English Proficiency Tests

Ratified and Promulgated by the President on November 21, 2006

Article 1 The Regulations for Awards to Students of I-Shou University Passing English Proficiency Tests (hereinafter referred to as the “Regulations”) are established to spur students of I-Shou University (hereinafter referred to as the “University”) to take English proficiency tests in an attempt to sharpen the English language skills.

Article 2 During their studies at the University, enrolled students (including those enrolled at post-baccalaureate programs) who have taken one of the following English proficiency tests and met the standards stated below are eligible to apply for an award.

This award scheme consists of four different levels: A, B, C and D. Each and every student is allowed to apply for an award for each level once only and is prohibited from applying for a lower level after having applied for a higher level.

To apply for an award, applicants must be enrolled at the University on both the examination date and the application date. Soon-to-be graduates shall submit an application by the deadline of May 31 every year.

Article 3 The award scheme consists of four levels:

1. Level A: Applicants who meet any of the following standards will be granted a registration subsidy of NT\$500 and prize money of NT\$3,500:
 - a. CAE level of Cambridge Main Suite;
 - b. ALTE Level 4 of Cambridge BULATS;

- c. a FLPT written score of 240-330 and a speaking score of S-3~5;
 - d. second stage of GEPT Advanced Level;
 - e. Level C1 of Global English Test;
 - f. a TOEFL-iBT score of 110 (26 for listening, 28 for reading, 28 for speaking, and 28 for writing); a TOEFL-ITP score of 191 (64 for listening comprehension, 63 for reading comprehension, and 64 for structure and written expression);
 - g. a TOEIC score of 945-990 (490 or higher for listening; 455 or higher for reading);
 - h. a IELTS score of 6.5 or higher; or
 - i. Advanced Level of NETPAW for listening, reading, speaking and writing.
2. Level B: Applicants who meet any of the following standards will be granted a registration subsidy of NT\$500 and prize money of NT\$2,000:
- a. FCE level of Cambridge Main Suite;
 - b. ALTE Level 3 of Cambridge BULATS;
 - c. a FLPT written score of 195-239 and a speaking score of S-2+;
 - d. second stage of GEPT High-Intermediate Level;
 - e. Level B2 of Global English Test;
 - f. a TOEFL-iBT score of 87 (21 for listening, 22 for reading, 23 for speaking, and 21 for writing); a TOEFL-ITP score of 163 (54 for listening comprehension, 56 for reading comprehension, and 53 for structure and written expression);
 - g. a TOEIC score of 785-940 (440 or higher for listening; 385 or higher for reading);
 - h. a IELTS score of 5.5 or higher;
 - i. a CSEPT Level 2 score of 240-360; or
 - j. High-intermediate Level of NETPAW for listening, reading, speaking and writing.
3. Level C: Applicants who meet any of the following standards will be granted a registration subsidy of NT\$500 and prize money of NT\$1,000:
- a. PET level of Cambridge Main Suite;
 - b. ALTE Level 2 of Cambridge BULATS;
 - c. a FLPT written score of 150-194 and a speaking score of S-2;
 - d. second stage of GEPT Intermediate Level;
 - e. Level B1 of Global English Test;
 - f. a TOEFL-iBT score of 57 (13 for listening, 8 for reading, 19 for speaking,

and 17 for writing); a TOEFL-ITP score of 138 (47 for listening comprehension, 48 for reading comprehension, and 43 for structure and written expression);

g. a TOEIC score of 550-780 (275 or higher for listening; 275 or higher for reading);

h. a IELTS score of 4.0 or higher;

i. a CSEPT Level 2 score of 180-239 or a CSEPT Level 1 score of 170-240; or

j. Intermediate Level of NETPAW for listening, reading, speaking and writing.

4. Level D: Applicants who meet either of the following standards will be granted a registration subsidy of NT\$500:

a. Intermediate Level of NETPAW for listening and reading; or

b. first stage of GEPT Intermediate Level.

Article 4 Applicants shall submit an application for the award to the Student Activity Section of the Office of Student Affairs (hereinafter referred to as the “Section”) within ten days after the test results are released. The Section will collect all applications and supporting documents, and then submit a petition to the Language Center for countersigning and to the President for ratification.

Article 5 To apply for the award, applicants shall submit a) a photocopy of the front and back of the student ID card, b) the score report (both the original and a photocopy; the original is returned to the applicant after verification while the photocopy is kept by the Section), c) a valid receipt of the registration fee (if the receipt is lost or not available, the applicant must attach a proof of payment; otherwise, the application will NOT be considered), and d) a photocopy of the cover of the applicant’s Post Office passbook to the Section. Applicants shall also submit an identity document (e.g. the passport) for verification should the name on the score report be in English.

Article 6 If any applicant has been absent from the BULATS test, the registration fee of the BULATS test shall be deducted from the award granted to him/her.

Article 7 The Regulations become effective on the third day of promulgation after being adopted by the University Administration Council and ratified by the President.

Note: In the event of any disputes or misunderstanding as to the interpretation of the language or terms of these Regulations, the Chinese language version shall prevail.
