

# Guidelines on Student Physical Education Courses at I-Shou University

Adopted at the Office Affairs Council of Student Affairs on  
January 20, 2003

- I. The *Guidelines on Student Physical Education Courses at I-Shou University* (hereinafter referred to as the “Guidelines”) is established as per the *Implementation Scheme of Physical Education at Senior High School Level or Above* issued by the Ministry of Education.
- II. According to the University regulations, students in the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> grade are required to take the PE course (twice a week, no credits), and students in the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> grade shall register the PE course (twice a week, 1 credit). The credits of PE course shall be counted in graduation credits.
- III. Students in the 1<sup>st</sup> grade shall take the PE course in the original class, and students in other grades will be divided into different classes according to the course registration results. The division of required PE course in the 2<sup>nd</sup> grade and registered PE courses in the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> grade shall be conducted separately.
- IV. The assessment of students’ performance in the PE course shall include sports skills (60%), learning attitude and sportsmanship (30%) and knowledge of physical education (10%).
- V. The sports skills are evaluated via the test of two sports in each semester, and learning attitude and sportsmanship is evaluated via class performance. The evaluation for knowledge of physical education is based on the knowledge of sports competitions held within or outside the University.
- VI. Students shall be failed if the score of the PE course is below 60, and they shall register the course again.
- VII. Students shall take the required PE courses of both 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> grade (four semesters in total) before graduation.
- VIII. Students who fail the required PE course of 1<sup>st</sup> grade may register the course again in the 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> grade, yet they shall not register the course in different semesters (e.g. students who fail the PE course in the first semester of 1<sup>st</sup> grade shall register the same course again in the first semester of 3<sup>rd</sup> grade).
- IX. Students who fail the required PE course of 2<sup>nd</sup> grade may register the course again in any

semesters of the 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> grade, yet they (including students who are required to make up the credits for the PE course) are not allowed to register required PE courses of two different types in the same semester simultaneously.

- X. Students shall not be recorded as absent if they are not able to attend the sports skills test due to duty-related injuries. Such students shall attend the make-up exam, and their grades shall not be deducted.
- XI. Teachers shall conduct the class indoor or give lectures on knowledge of physical education or relevant theory if it is raining or the weather is bad.
- XII. Students shall apply for leaves if they are not able to attend the PE class for some reason.
- XIII. For students who are not able to perform intense exercise or freshmen who are not able to attend the swimming class over a long period of time due to physical conditions, they shall submit the certificate issued by public or teaching hospitals to the Office of Physical Education and apply for the registration of adapted physical education courses.
- XIV. Students shall wear the required sports outfits to attend the PE class.
- XV. Students shall attend the PE class in accordance with the school calendar when the semester begins, and they are not allowed to attend the class after the course addition/withdrawal.
- XVI. Students shall apply for course addition/withdrawal in accordance with the regulations of course registration stipulated by the Office of Academic Affairs if the class schedule is overlapped.
- XVII. The Guidelines become effective on the third day of promulgation upon the adoption by the Office Affairs Council of Student Affairs and ratification by the President. Amendments must also undergo the same procedures.

*Note: In the event of any disputes or misunderstanding as to the interpretation of the language or terms of the Guidelines, the Chinese language version shall prevail.*
