

Regulations for the Training, Management and Grants for Project Varsity Basketball Team of I-Shou University

Ratified and promulgated by the President on August 8,
2012

Amendments to Articles 2~4 and 6~9 ratified and
promulgated by the President on October 15, 2014

- Article 1 The Regulations for the Training, Management and Grants for Project Varsity Basketball Team of I-Shou University (hereinafter referred to as “the Regulations”) are made with the aim of recruiting excellent basketball players with great potential to represent I-Shou University (hereinafter referred to as “the University”) to take part in games, acquiring high reputation for the University and the country.
- Article 2 The Regulations are applicable to students of the project varsity basketball team of the University (hereinafter referred to as “student athletes”).
The Office of Physical Education is responsible for the affairs mentioned herein.
- Article 3 The grant amount is equal to 100% of the tuition and other required fees and/or on-campus accommodation fees for every semester. The foregoing grant will not be awarded in cash.
The foregoing grant will be awarded to qualified student athletes after an application in writing has been filed by the coach, reviewed by the Office of Physical Education, approved by the Office Affairs Council of the Office of Student Affairs, and finally ratified by the President.
- Article 4 The grant shall be awarded only to currently enrolled students of the University, and the award period is a maximum of six years for undergraduate students, four years for master’s students, and two years for doctoral students.
- Article 5 The coach shall submit the list of student athletes who are qualified for the grant mentioned above to the Office of Physical Education before the first day of school in every semester.
- Article 6 A student athlete will be disqualified from receiving the grant if he/she suspends the schooling, transfers to another school, withdraws from the University, or withdraws from the varsity while studying at the University. Those who withdraw from the varsity shall return the grant they have received on a pro-rata basis.
- Article 7 The grant shall be suspended if any of the following circumstances happens:

1. A recipient has received a major demerit or severer punishment.
2. A recipient who is unable to cooperate with the coach or take part in the training and games arranged by the coach shall be suspended from receiving the grant after being reported to the Office Affairs Council of the Office of Physical Education in writing for review and ratified by the President.
3. A recipient who has conducted a severe violation shall be suspended from receiving the grant after being reported to the Office Affairs Council of the Office of Physical Education in writing for review and ratified by the President.

Grant recipients shall complete 12 hours of on-campus service arranged by the Office of Physical Education in the semester of receiving the grant.

Article 8 The coach shall formulate a training plan and draw up a budget proposal at least one month prior to the beginning of every academic year, and the training plan and the budget proposal shall be actually implemented.

Article 9 Student athletes may apply for grants under the Regulations for Rewarding Students with Outstanding Sports Achievements by I-Shou University if they fulfill the criteria stated in the aforesaid Regulations.

Article 10 Student athletes who have represented the University and received awards from games shall be rewarded pursuant to the Regulations for Awarding Grants to Students for Excellent Performance in Sports.

Article 11 The grants for student athletes representing the University to compete in games are subject to the Regulations for Student Sports Teams to Participate in the Off-campus Sports Competitions at I-Shou University.

Article 12 Student athletes are obligated to assist the University with sports activities and the maintenance of sports fields and facilities.

Article 13 Any student athletes with great potential as recommended by the coach may be given official leave for training after the training plan prepared by the coach is ratified by the President.

Article 14 The University shall provide free accommodation to student athletes for better management and intensive training so as to increase the effectiveness of training based on the needs for training and games held during winter and summer vacations.

Article 15 Any matter not mentioned herein shall be subject to the applicable regulations and rules of the University.

Article 16 The Regulations become effective on the third of promulgation after being adopted by the University Administration Council and ratified by the President.

Note: In the event of any disputes or misunderstanding as the interpretation of the language or

terms of these Regulations, the Chinese language version shall prevail.
