

Regulations for the Training, Management and Grants for Varsity Baseball Team of I-Shou University

Ratified and promulgated by the President on July 26, 2013
Amendments to Articles 2~5, 7~10, 12 and 13 ratified and
promulgated by the President on December 22, 2014

- Article 1 The Regulations for the Training, Management and Grants for Varsity Baseball Team of I-Shou University (hereinafter referred to as “the Regulations”) are made with the aim of recruiting excellent baseball players with great potential to represent I-Shou University (hereinafter referred to as “the University”) to take part in games, acquiring high reputation for the University and the country.
- Article 2 The Regulations are applicable to students of the varsity baseball team of the University (hereinafter referred to as “student athletes”).
The Office of Physical Education is responsible for the affairs mentioned herein.
- Article 3 The grants are categorized by type:
1. exemption from the tuition and other required fees and on-campus accommodation fees for every semester;
 2. exemption from the tuition and other required fees for every semester; or
 3. exemption from on-campus accommodation fees for every semester.
- The on-campus accommodation fees can be exempted only when a student athlete resides in the designated dormitory. For those who reside in other dormitories, they are required to pay the difference.
- The foregoing grants will not be awarded in cash. Any student athlete who gives up the grant will be deemed as giving up the right to receive the grant.
- Article 4 The foregoing grants shall be awarded after an application in writing has been filed by the coach, reviewed by the unit-in-charge, approved by the Office Affairs Council of the Office of Student Affairs (hereinafter referred to as “the Council”), and finally ratified by the President. The unit-in-charge shall notify the unsuccessful applicant(s) in writing of the reason for failing the grant criteria.
- Article 5 The University will recruit certain number of student athletes based on planning, and the coach shall prepare an evaluation report about the performance of student athletes at the end of every semester. The evaluation report shall serve as an important reference

to the grants and the number of grant recipients for the next semester after being reviewed and revised by the Council and ratified by the President.

Article 6 The coach shall submit the list of student athletes who are qualified for the grants mentioned above to the Office of Physical Education before the first day of school in every semester.

Article 7 The grants shall be awarded only to currently enrolled undergraduate students of the University, and the award period is a maximum of four years.

Article 8 A student athlete will be disqualified from receiving the grant if he/she suspends the schooling, transfers to another school, withdraws from the University or withdraws from the varsity while studying at the University. Those who are disqualified from receiving the grant shall return the grant they have received on a pro-rata basis.

Article 9 The grant shall be suspended if any of the following circumstances happens:

1. A recipient who is unable to cooperate with the coach or take part in the training and games arranged by the coach shall be suspended from receiving the grant after being reported to the Council in writing for review and ratified by the President.
2. A recipient who has received a major demerit, three minor demerits or more or has conducted a severe violation in the previous semester shall be suspended from receiving the grant after being reported to the Council in writing for review and ratified by the President.

Article 10 Student athletes must not sign any contracts with neither domestic nor overseas professional and amateur baseball teams. Violators will not only be suspended from receiving the grant and asked to return the grant they have received in the current semester but also be expelled from the varsity.

Article 11 The coach shall formulate a training plan and draw up a budget proposal at least one month prior to the beginning of every academic year. The training plan and the budget proposal shall not be implemented until they are reviewed by the unit-in-charge and the Council and ratified by the President.

Article 12 Student athletes who have represented the University and received awards from games shall be rewarded pursuant to the Regulations for Awarding Grants to Students for Excellent Performance in Sports.

Article 13 The grants for student athletes representing the University to compete in games are subject to the Regulations for Student Sports Teams to Participate in the Off-campus Sports Competitions at I-Shou University.

Article 14 Student athletes are obligated to assist the University with sports activities and the maintenance of sports fields and facilities.

- Article 15 Any student athletes with great potential as recommended by the coach may be given official leave for training after the training plan prepared by the coach is reviewed by the unit-in-charge and the Council and ratified by the President.
- Article 16 The University may provide free accommodation to student athletes for better management and intensive training so as to increase the effectiveness of training based on the needs for training and games held during winter and summer vacations.
- Article 17 Any matter not mentioned herein shall be subject to the applicable regulations and rules of the University.
- Article 18 The Regulations become effective on the third of promulgation after being adopted by the University Administration Council and ratified by the President.

Note: In the event of any disputes or misunderstanding as the interpretation of the language or terms of these Regulations, the Chinese language version shall prevail.
