Some international students want to know more about it because they prefer a twin room.</p> | <p>Office of International and Cross-Strait Affairs</p> | <p>According to the arrangements made by the Office of Student Affairs and the Office of International and Cross-Strait Affairs, only Dormitory 1 (quadruple rooms) and ISU International House III (triple rooms) are available for new students to apply for campus accommodation in the first semester on the Information System. The accommodation information of Dormitory 1 and ISU International House III are available in the new student handbook and on the Information System. In and after the next semester, twin rooms (including those in Dormitory 2) are available for students, and they can apply to the Student Housing Section or ISU International House I.</p> |
| | | <p>Office of General Affairs</p> | <p>ISU International House I is available for student accommodation. Each room can accommodate two persons, and the monthly rent is NT\$7,000 per month/person (a deposit of NT\$7,000 should be paid, and the electricity bill will be charged separately). The room is equipped with many amenities, such as desks, chairs, beds, bed sheets, quilts, pillows, refrigerator, television, air conditioner, and cable TV service. Room cleaning service is provided once a week. A special discount of one month's free accommodation is offered to those who have resided at ISU International House I for an entire academic year. Freshman students are required to take required general English courses in both the first and second semesters, and they will be placed into a suitable class depending on their English proficiency.</p> <p>II. Due to a lower birth rate and the learning gap among students, the International College has asked its departments to offer an elective in the first semester for freshman students since Academic Year 2017. Each department selects and asks students whose English proficiency is inadequate to take the elective with the aim of strengthening their learning motivation and helping them accommodate themselves to the all English learning environment.</p> |
