

Regulations of Scholarship for Students with Excellent Performances in Sports at I-Shou University

Article 1 The *Regulations of Scholarship for Students with Excellent Performances in Sports at I-Shou University* (hereinafter referred to as the “Regulations”) is hereby established to promote sports activities and participation within the University, enhance students’ sports skills and win honors for the University.

Article 2 Students enrolled in the University who represent the University or Taiwan to participate in the sports competitions in accordance with the *Regulations for Student Sports Teams to Participate in the Off-campus Sports Competitions at I-Shou University* shall apply for the scholarship if they satisfy the following requirements:

1. Students who are selected to represent Taiwan to participate and won the top six places for team sports or individual sports in Olympics Games, World Games, Universiade, Asian Games, East Asian Games or world/intercontinental/Asia/Asia Pacific Region championships held by international federations or Asia/Asia Pacific regional federations of individual sports.
2. Students who participated and won the top six places at the top level group of team open or individual open in National Intercollegiate Athletic Games, college championships of individual sports or college sports league.
3. Students who participated and won the top six places at the second level group of team open or individual open in National Intercollegiate Athletic Games, college championships of individual sports or college sports league.
4. Students who participated and won the top six places at individual, team or third

level open group in championships held by national federations of individual sports, or in National Intercollegiate Athletic Games, college championships of individual sports or college sports league.

5. Students shall be deemed as participating in the general group if there is no specific division of groups or levels in the sports competitions.
6. The scholarship for team sports shall be granted according to the actual number of players registered (as shown on the game schedules).

Students who participated in invitational tournaments, demonstration competitions or friendly matches are not allowed to receive the scholarship.

Article 3 The approved number of scholarship recipients:

1. Individual Sports:
 - A. 3-5 applicants: 1 recipient
 - B. 6-8 applicants: 2 recipients
 - C. 9-12 applicants: 3 recipients
 - D. 13-16 applicants: 4 recipients
 - E. 17-20 applicants: 5 recipients
 - F. 21 applicants or above: 6 recipients
2. Team Sports:
 - A. 4-5 teams: 2 recipients
 - B. 6-7 teams: 3 recipients
 - C. 8-9 teams: 4 recipients
 - D. 10-11 teams: 5 recipients
 - E. 12 teams or above: 6 recipients

Article 4 The amount of scholarship granted is shown in the following table:

Article 5 Students who satisfy the aforesaid requirements shall file the application to the coaches

within two weeks after the competitions. Eligible recipients will be commended at the important assembly of the University during the semester.

Article 6 Students who receive the scholarship may enjoy the priority to apply for the University dorm with the approval of the Dean of Student Affairs.

Article 7 The Regulations become effective on the third day of promulgation upon the adoption by the University Administration Council and ratification by the President.

Note: In the event of any disputes or misunderstanding as to the interpretation of the language or terms of the Regulations, the Chinese language version shall prevail.
