

# **Guidelines on Application for Free Dormitory Accommodation by Students from Low-income Families to I-Shou University**

Adopted on April 12, 2006 at the first meeting of the  
University Administration Council in the second semester  
of the academic year 2005

## **I. Legal Basis:**

The Guidelines on Application for Free Dormitory Accommodation by Students from Low-income Families to I-Shou University (hereinafter referred to as the “Guidelines”) are enacted as per the Guidelines on Study Supporting Measures of the University to help enrolled students (including undergraduate programs, evening programs for bachelor’s degree, master’s programs, in-service master’s programs and doctoral programs) concentrate on studies without worrying anything else.

## **II. Application Qualifications:**

Students from low-income families who have officially enrolled at the University (including undergraduate programs, evening programs for bachelor’s degree, master’s programs, in-service master’s programs and doctoral programs) are eligible to apply. It is to be noted that the following students are NOT eligible: those without sufficient credits to graduate, extending the period of study due to double majors or minors, or studying at the Extension Education Center.

## **III. Application Deadline and Methods:**

1. New enrollees shall complete and submit an application form in every August for review.
2. Enrolled students shall complete and submit an application form by the deadline announced by the University for review.
3. Students who resume studies shall complete an application form and mail it before the deadline applicable to new enrollees for review.

## **IV. Supporting Document and Subsidy Standard:**

1. a certificate of low-income status issued by a township/city/district office (issued in the year in which an application is filed) and the original household transcript.
2. Approved applicants will reside in the University’s dormitories.

## **V. The Guidelines become effective on the day of promulgation after adopted by the University Administration Council and ratified by the President. The same procedure applies to any amendment to the Guidelines.**

*Note: In the event of any disputes or misunderstanding as to the interpretation of the language or terms of these Guidelines, the Chinese language version shall prevail.*
